



We have the usual sort of overprint errors



The 'shaky hand' varieties are usually associated with handstamps. In this case it may be just careless handling of the plate.

And an unusual error



This error is stated to be in stamp 2 row 1 Source (Darlow, Ledger, Najjar, Souan, Stanley Gibbons)

Stamp positions 35, 36



Stamp position 25

With the overprint error occurring at position 2 of the overprint plate, an inverted overprint should appear on stamp position 35. The appearance on stamp 25 is either due to a gross misplacement of the overprint plate or the error also occurred at position 12 of the overprint plate – a new discovery.
